


In 1986, Christopher Knight drove his car up to the woods of Maine and lived in solitude for twenty-seven years. As they say, truth is stranger than fiction.




[Then She Was Gone](#) by Lisa Jewell


[I Love You, Michael Collins](#) by Lauren Baratz-Logsted
