ABOUT ONE BOOK-ONE LINCOLN: One Book-One Lincoln is a community reading project sponsored by Lincoln City Libraries. The program encourages all adults in Lincoln and Lancaster County to read and discuss the same book at the same time.

The goal of the program is to encourage reading and dialogue by creating a community-wide reading and discussion experience. The One Book-One Lincoln winner is selected by the community from a group of three finalists.

ABOUT THE SELECTION COMMITTEE: The One Book-One Lincoln Selection Committee is a 15-person group of diverse community readers. They review and/or read all books nominated by the community for One Book-One Lincoln, refining them to a list of 10 top contenders and then three finalists.

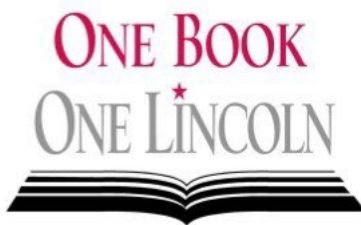
ABOUT THE SELECTED BOOKS: The committee's goal is to look for books that are of general interest to adults and young adults, address universal themes of life, and spark thoughtful discussion. Selected titles should have substance and general appeal.

The community is looking for an interesting, thought-provoking story with beautifully written language, well developed characters, fascinating settings and clear plots. They want something they can connect with personally and something they can talk about with others.

CRITERIA FOR COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP:

- Committed to taking on the workload and participating fully
- Available to attend online meetings via Zoom from February – April during the selection process
- Broad in perspective, inclusive in thinking and sensitive to social issues and biases of our time
- Enjoy reading and talking about books
- See possibilities for translating reading to life issues
- Willing to participate in the give and take of group discussions

TIME COMMITMENT REQUIREMENTS: The committee will begin its work the first week in February and continues for eight weeks, concluding by late March or early April. The committee meets four times during this period, and there are three rounds of reading. Committee members read between five to eight books each round, or 15 to 24 books over the eight weeks. The three finalists are selected in early April and announced on Memorial Day in late May. Committee terms are for three years.

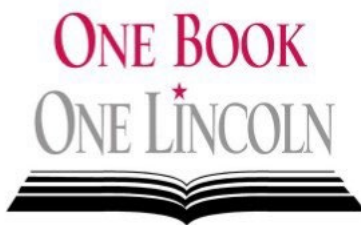
